Trivia quiz: July Is Hotdog Month





And Baked Beans Month. Most websites agree that the geographical origin of baked beans was what is now the northeastern U.S. The dish was common among the Narragansett, Penobscot, and Iroquois tribes and shared with Pilgrims in the 1600s. According to a common myth, a chief in one of those tribes threw his tomahawk into a tree one evening before bed. When he pulled it out the next morning, sap began to flow. The chief

tasted it, saw the possibilities and had his meat – and later his beans – cooked in it. The Pilgrims eventually substituted molasses and pork fat for their hosts' maple syrup and bear fat. Dozens of other variations have arisen since then.

But as for the geographic origin of hotdogs, well, it's hotly disputed.



- d. If you are over 18, don't put ketchup on your hotdog.



If you serve hotdogs at your house and have always wondered, "Why are there typically 10 hotdogs per pack and 8 buns per bag?" the council's answer is: Originally, people purchased hotdogs from their butchers in whatever quantities they desired, but since 1940, they have been packaged in groups of 10. The buns come in eight-packs because they are baked in pans that hold a total of eight rolls in two clusters of four. More recently, some bakers and butchers have become a bit more flexible. Hot diggity!

Notes:

- 2. New York was #2, Dallas #3, Chicago #4. If the figures are surprising, remember we are talking total hotdog consumption; many residents of these cities eat other kinds of sausage. If we look at the *per capita* figure, the top four are Paducah, KY, Greensboro, NC, Charlotte, NC, and Buffalo, NY.
- 3. About 63% prefer grilled
- 5-10. Note that different websites suggest different ingredients, and some changes reflect personal preferences. Some people, regardless of where they are from, will add relish, grilled onions, peppers, shredded cheese, their preferred mustard, and anything

else they desire, (olives, lettuce) and, yes, ketchup, even though it's supposedly impolite to do so.

13. Cheese comes after the chunky stuff, and celery salt and other spices are last.
16. Do serve beer, soda, or lemonade. Do use paper plates or everyday dishes. Do lick your fingers. According to Dirty Harry (movie) never use ketchup. Also, don't get too fancy with your buns (plain, sesame or poppyseed are acceptable; no sun-dried tomatoes buns) and do eat *all* of your bun.
